This novel, set in the early-1900s-era New Orleans, is an eye-popping tale of how one man's rage at the murder and degradation of his people in addition to the raping and humiliation of black women spurs him to assemble a team of fearless warriors dedicating their lives to eradicating racism and bigotry. With Herculean strength and Einstein's intellectual horsepower, these leaders were armed to confront racial injustice while defending their women, children and the elderly all while providing the helpless with the metaphorical hope that other comic book super heroes, like Zorro and The Shadow, represented...
